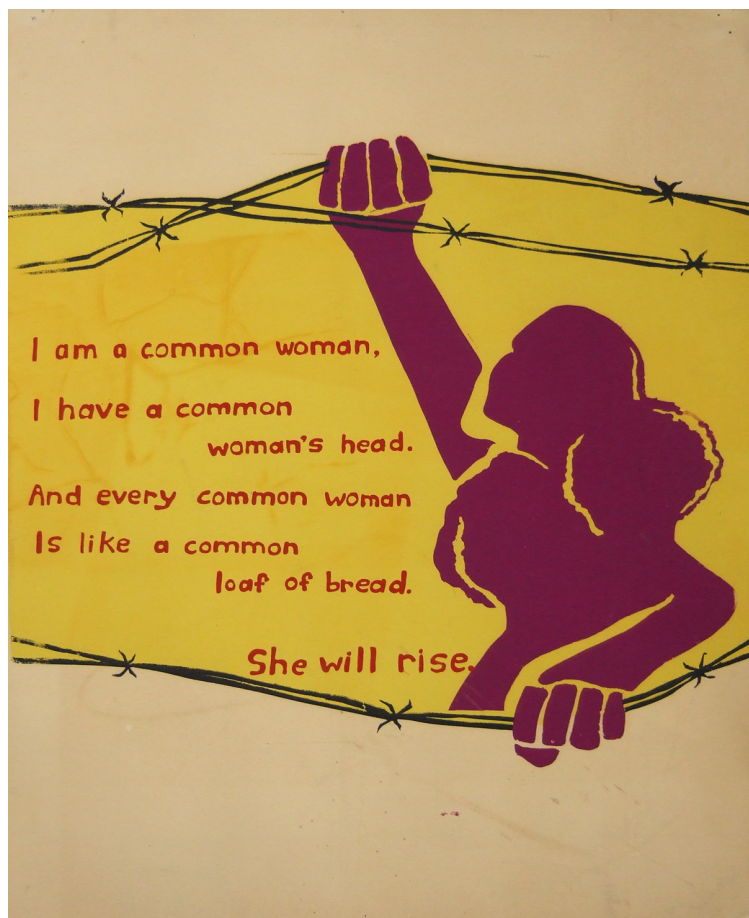


Recovering a Lost Cultural Herstory 1969-1982: NYC Feminist Artists Speak Out

In the era of Civil Rights, the Vietnam War, and the “Women’s Liberation” movement, what were women artists doing? This event remembers one of the key strategies of feminists across the 1970s -- “Consciousness Raising” (CR) groups, weekly collective meetings where women discussed, analyzed, and argued about life, politics, and art. The women artists’ CR groups in New York mobilized action for feminist issues in general and to protest against the sexist policies of galleries and museums. In this “Speak Out,” artists who participated in those CR groups will each speak about their experiences, after which they will invite audience members to participate and “speak out.”
